Branford Evangelical Free Church (BE Free Church) is a member of the Evangelical Free Church of America (EFCA) and is located on the shore of Long Island Sound, in Branford, Connecticut. We are Elder-led, theologically conservative, and value Bible-based preaching. As a church family we prioritize supportive relationships, generosity of time and resources, and fellowship with one another. Our attendees often say that BE Free "feels like" home," a sentiment that reflects our roots as a home Bible study. Since our founding, BE Free has employed four Senior Pastors. We have been blessed with a lineage of faithful leaders who knit themselves fully into the church and community and served long tenures. We currently seek a Senior Pastor who will join our church family and bring new energy to lead us faithfully into future ministry and growth.

History

BE Free Church began as a home Bible study in 1956, led originally by Pastor Herb Gale and later Pastor Paul Engle. In 1977, following Pastor Engle's departure to pursue his PhD, Pastor Walter Westerholm was hired as Senior Pastor.

Pastor Westerholm was a prayerful and relational leader with a passion for discipleship and outreach. Under his leadership, BE Free grew both spiritually and numerically. In 1986, BE Free moved to its current building, the construction of which was largely completed by church members. During this season, BE Free continued to grow, had strong discipleship pathways, and raised up and sent missionaries into the field.

History

Pastor Steve Chamberlain initially served as Assistant Pastor under Pastor Westerholm. In 1998, he was called to the role of Senior Pastor and remained in that role until his retirement in October of 2022. Pastor Chamberlain continued Pastor Westerholm's legacy of Bible-based preaching and it was under their combined leadership that BE Free planted a sister church in nearby Madison. Pastor Chamberlain and his wife, Lois, were strong and relational leaders, who had attended and served in many capacities since 1979. We are thankful for their many years of faithfulness.

BE Free Now

As with most churches, the COVID-19 pandemic introduce unique challenges. At BE Free we saw contention surrounding COVID policies but we also saw a depth of love and commitment that held the church together in spite of the difficulties and disagreements. Following the pandemic, we have faced significant changes.

In the summer of 2022 our Senior Pastor announced his intention to retire following a 24-year tenure; he officially retired in late October of the same year. Coinciding with this, the Elder Board engaged NL Moore & Associates to conduct an in-depth analysis of the church and provide guidance regarding the search for a new Senior Pastor.

BE Free Now

Following NL Moore's recommendations it was determined that we should seek an Intentional Interim Pastor to help the church improve conflict resolution and overall church health in preparation for a new Senior Pastor. The Elder Board secured the services of Vital Church Ministries to provide an Intentional Interim Pastor and lead the church through a revisioning process. Pat Hand started as our Intentional Interim Pastor in April of 2023.

In addition to our Senior Pastor's retirement, we recently parted ways with our long-time Assistant Pastor. We have seen a significant shift in our membership as a result. This has been a particularly difficult transition but we are thankful for a core of committed congregants who have weathered this season with grace.

BE Free Now

In the midst of these challenges we know that God is good. BE Free continues to be a faithful body of believers who are excited to see how God will work in and through our church family. We believe that BE Free is poised for positive change and we are excited to re-orient our ministries toward intentional discipleship and a renewed focus on outreach. Our greatest desire is to glorify God and share His goodness with our community.

With the exeption of Weekly Attendance and Voting Members, all church demographic information was gathered by NL Moore in the summer of 2022.

Tenure:

Our Church family is primarily composed of long-time attendees. 80% of our church family has been here 5 years or more, with 38% of those attendees reporting a tenure of over 20 years.


Average Household Income:


\$108,467 BE Free \$119,683 Branford

Over the past 10+ years we have seen our church body trend older. This is an area we seek to change by attracting and retaining young adults and families with children.






Ethnic Background:

According to the 2020 Census, Branford has a population that is approximately 85% white alone, with the largest minority groups being Latino (6.7%), Asian (3.8%), Black or African American (3.3%) and two or more races (3.7%). By comparison, BE Free Church attendees reported the following ethnic backgrounds: White (94%), Black/African American (1%), Latino (1%), Other (4%).



Branford is a picturesque New England town with a population of 28,000. Located on the shore of Long Island Sound, it is about 10 miles from New Haven, CT and Yale University. Branford is ideally located for entertainment, shopping, and adventure. Within an hour's travel, there is an abundance of museums and cultural attractions available. Additionally, within two hours (or less) one can travel to New York City, Boston, Rhode Island, Vermont, New Hampshire, and Massachusetts.

Branford and surrounding communities have increasing numbers of foreign-born residents and households that are headed by moms and dads, or unmarried singles.
